COMMUNITY CONNECTIONS SCHOOL- BASED SOCIAL WORKER


School based social work is voluntary service that works alongside young people adaptively via **site-based** appointments or **outreach**.

The program is **tailored** to meet the needs of the school and supports young people and their families to address factors contributing to a risk of early school and/or home leaving.

COMMUNITY CONNECTIONS SBSW CAN PROVIDE

- Support outside of school system and referral for team support during holiday periods
- Outreach flexibility to meet young people in the community
- Direct relationships with community resources and access to information e.g., housing, emergency relief and external referrals
- Individual and family counselling and support
- Group work facilitation
- Community and organisational responses

COMMUNITY SBSW INTERVENTIONS

- Mental Health: general counselling, safety planning and risk assessments, exposure therapy, traumainformed frameworks
- Accommodation: support to access youth accommodation services and QHIP assessment process
- Support and Advocacy: Human Services Australia (Centrelink)
- Navigating systems: understanding payments and eligibility criteria, collecting points of identification e.g., sourcing birth certificate, passport, setting up bank account, Medicare card
- Accessing support: transporting young people to appointments such as housing services for interviews, general practitioners, external counselling and to attend school
- External resources: emergency relief, food packages and community resources
- Therapeutic family work: reconciling with family members, parent-child system, developmental stages and conflict resolution
- External referrals: Legal Aid, Youth Advocacy Centre, sexual assault counselling and support, AOD, Sisters Inside and family support services

ISSUES COMMONLY ADDRESSED

- Family issues impacting a young person (conflict, finances, housing, mental and/or physical health)
- Mental health
- Grief and loss
- Domestic and family violence
- Substance use
- Gender identity and diversity
- Students living independently
- Peer and intimate relationships
